I'm purposefully addressing the music first. Be sure to find a revised schedule on my page 2.. Thanks!

• Tenors – We need to change a pitch in your music. I discovered it while studying the orchestral score. In mvt. 4, p. 51, (m.186), please move your B-flat up one line, so you sing a D. It may take extra care to make the change, but the D makes more sense, too. Thanks!

EVERYONE: -- Music wants to move horizontally. It happens in the realm of time. While you're walking, remind yourself that you want to step into each new phrase you sing. It should rarrely feel stagnant. Even when you're responding to a note under a FERMATA, the music is moving! So enjoy walking musically between now and the concert!

• Basses -- Please work to correct your entrance in m.66. Thanks!

•Sopranos – p. 34 Letter E (m. 129, Jon said he hears some singing the wrong rhythm – changing pitch too soon. I'm conducting in 3; you want to be thinking the two quarters inside each half. How to fix it: Tapping quarter-notes, and singing the word "Ach," be sure to **tap three times before you move** to the eighth-note (E) and breathe, before you sing the word "wie."

EVERONE: Whenever you get to sing the opening melody – let it feel organic – always growing!

- Take a look at m. 131-132 -- Remember to include the tapering out of 131 into 132
- ALTOS a reminder to look up at that moment, as we insert a hair more space before you sing. "Selig, sind die Toten." Look at m. 147. Goodness, you sound wonderful singing that phrase! How about using that same tone in m. 132? Other places, too? :--)

A DRILL to SPEAK & SING several times: Use an EE sound when singing these German words?

(Yes, I've exaggerated on purpose.)

- MVT. 1: Selig, werden, gehen, edlen
- MVT. 2: Der, Erde, den, Morgenregn, Abendregen, Ewigkeit, Erlöseten, ewige
- MVT. 3: lehre, Leben, gehen, wer, Der, Seelen
- MVT. 4: Zebaoth, Seele, sehnet, den, dem, denen
- MVT. 5: sehen, nehmen, Sehet
- MVT. 6: werden, der, unverweslich, steht, den, nehman, Ehre, Wegen
- MVT. 7: Selig, dem, der
